Keeping Myself Safe Guidance for Volunteers



Protecting yourself

Visitors to our school should ensure that anything they say or do with children is done openly and with the knowledge of staff.

Remember, anything you say or do could be misinterpreted no matter how well intended so please follow these guidelines.



- Please ensure that you always sign in and out at Reception.
- Please collect and wear a visitors lanyard from Reception.
- If you have a DBS then please make sure that the school office has a record of this.
- If you don't have a DBS check then please make sure that staff are aware and appropriate precautions will be taken.

- Always make sure that a member of staff knows where you are working.
- Do not take children in a room or enclosed space on your own.
- Do not engage in inappropriate behaviour or contact.
- Do not make suggestive remarks or use inappropriate language.
- Do not make direct contact with children that you have met in school by phone, email or social networking.
- Do not join in with children's contact games.
