



## Sports Premium Funding 2017 – 18

The Government is providing additional funding to primary schools to improve the quality of PE and sport provision. In the current academic year this is doubling from £160 million to £320 million a year.

The PE and Sport Premium is part of a series of programmes to improve healthy lifestyles among pupils and tackle childhood obesity.

For 2017 – 18 this equates to **£18,230** for our school.

### It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

We have allocated the funding in the following ways:

### As an outcome from our sport and PE focus we have:

- Specialist Activity Professionals delivering high quality Sport and PE teaching, enriching and enhancing the curriculum
- Specialist staff demonstrating, coaching and advising teachers regarding delivery of lessons.

- Access to high quality planning and assessment tool to evaluate and track delivery and impact
- Staff continue to apply increased confidence and skill in delivering the Physical Education curriculum
- Progress maintained within the Physical Education for pupils evidenced within lessons, by pupils working to exceed their personal bests.
- School staff specialist skills are utilised, specifically in dance, with Gifted and Talented pupils supported towards performances
- Forest School sessions – additional opportunities to access to learning outdoors beyond the regular timetabled sessions
- The number and range of clubs extended, both provided by the school and by other providers at a charge. The number of pupils participating in sports clubs available increases.
- School targets pupil groups for engagement within the school day.
- A targeted approach to festivals and competitions entered by the school continued, such as Cyclocross, Cross County and Ability Games
- Leaders, working closely with Premier Sports staff, ensured that festivals and competitions are part of a termly focus so that pupils were well prepared and ensured an ongoing profile of our school as a keen participant in sporting events
